- ❖ what background sounds can be heard

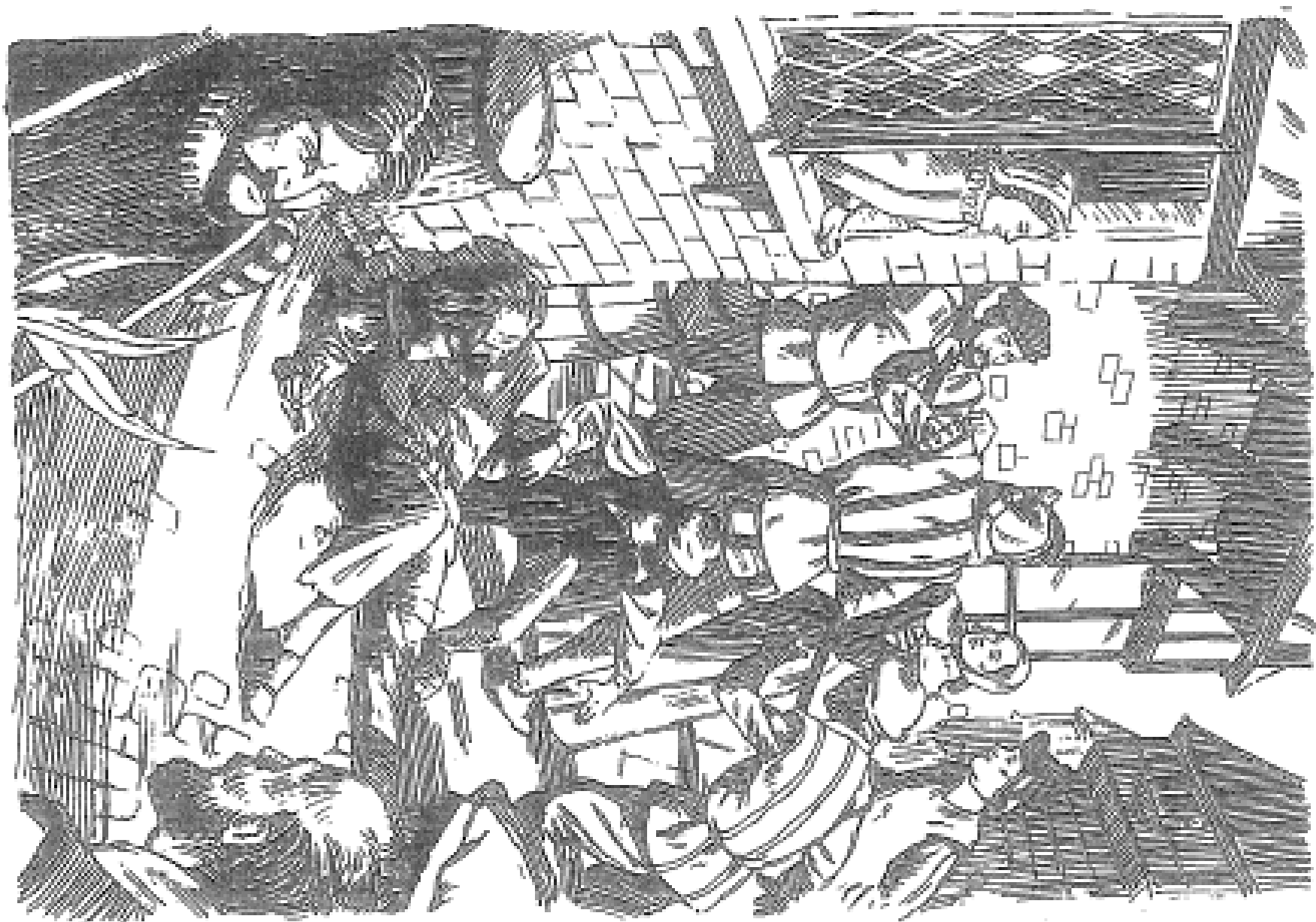


Write a description of the city scene which links the three focal groups.

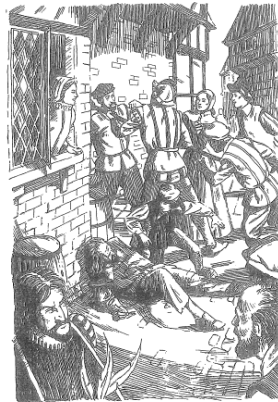
